

Holy Week Resources & Events Join us April 5-12

In the Christian calendar, the week from Palm Sunday to Easter is the most significant for followers of Christ. With the Covid-19 precautions in effect this year, we are unable to host our usual gatherings through the week, so Grace is offering some alternative resources and events to help mark this special week!

Palm Sunday Worship – A Palm Sunday theme service will go up on the church website and YouTube Channel on Saturday.

Daily Devotional Videos – Each day Monday to Thursday, and Saturday a 10-minute video will highlight what was happening with Jesus on that day during holy week. You will find the videos on the church YouTube channel and a link will be provided on the front page of the church website each morning.

Live Maundy Thursday Service – Join pastor Peter's family live via Zoom for a special service of communion of songs, readings, and the Lord's Supper, at 6pm on Thursday April 9. You can prepare for communion in your home, by having some bread and juice ready for your household which then can then be taken at the same time during the online service. A Zoom link will be provided in the mid-week update in the congregational email.

Good Friday Worship – We're putting together a special video featuring music from previous Good Friday services along with a new Good Friday Message from the pastor.

Live Early Easter Service – Join Pastor Marilyn at 7am for an Easter Sunrise Service via Facebook Live. Search Facebook @Grace Memorial Baptist. Trouble finding it? Try refreshing the page, most icons look similar to this icon at the top left corner of the screen. It will also be posted later on the Grace Memorial Baptist Church Youtube channel.

Easter Sunday Worship On-Line Celebration – A special Easter Service will be recorded and posted to the church website which you can watch anytime. You can also join others in worship at 10:30am as we watch the service together via Zoom and have a chance greet one another on Easter Sunday. A Zoom link will be provided in the mid-week update in the congregational email.

NB Workers Emergency Income Benefit

Benefit offered by the Government of New Brunswick, in partnership with the Canadian Red Cross – A one-time income benefit of \$900 is available for workers or self-employed people residing in New Brunswick who have lost their job due to the state of emergency. The benefit will help to bridge the gap between when a person lost their job or closed their business on or after March 15, 2020, to when the national benefit takes effect. Check the website, www2.gnb.ca, search for **NB Workers Emergency Income Benefit** to see if you qualify. If there is more than one adult in your family applying for this benefit, **each adult must submit their own** registration and application separately. **The benefit will end on April 30, 2020.** If you know of others who could benefit from this, please contact them.

Don't have an email address or Internet access? You can also apply by telephone, by speaking with a Canadian Red Cross agent at **1-800-863-6582 (from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., 7 days a week)**. The phones are very busy, so if you can do online, ask someone to help you, it's much faster.

- Pre-Authorized Debit You can set up an automatic withdrawal from your account to Grace. We have had this option for several years and a many people are using it. If you wish to start, contact the office and we can email you the forms to fill out and walk you through the process if you'd like.

Prayer request from the Soucy's – During these uncertain times may we be mindful of your presence each day! Thank you for the quiet space that we are experiencing due to imposed self-isolation.
