SUN-LITE INITIATIVE FOR HOMELESSNESS WANT TO CHANGE A LIFE? WANT TO MAKE A **DIFFERENCE IN HOMELESSNESS IN FREDERICTON?**

We are looking for two more people, in partnership with Brunswick Street Baptist and Smythe Street Church, to work with three people experiencing homelessness or near homelessness.

Purpose: In very a practical way, to show people God's love by assisting them overcome homelessness. Each team of six people (2 from each church) will partner with one client to help him/her maintain safe, stable, affordable housing. The clients will be identified by the Supportive Housing Network Committee who will ensure the clients have adequate housing and furnishings. The teams will act as encouragers and friends, helping the client identify goals in recovery from homelessness and resources to achieve those goals.

Expectations:

- ♦ 6-8 hours per week for the overall team. (i.e. Hours divided among the 6 team members)
- Once a week check-in with the client.
- Communicate weekly with-in the team on the client's progress.
- Once per month meeting with program coordinator to discuss client needs and team dynamics.
- Mid-year and end of the year evaluation.

Requirements:

- Criminal Record Check
- One-day training in the SUN-Lite Program (9am-4pm Saturday April 24) Friday Evening/Saturday training in Applied Suicide
- Intervention Skills Friday Evening/Saturday training in Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (May 7 & 8)
- ♦ One-year Commitment.
