

Ways to Give – Thank you for your faithful giving during this period when many find it difficult. It is a blessing to our Grace Community of Faith. We currently have four methods of giving:

- Pre-Authorized Debit This is probably the easiest way to maintain your regular giving. You can set up an automatic withdrawal from your account to Grace. We have had this option for several years and a many people are using it. If you wish to start, contact the office and we can email you the forms to fill out and walk you through the process if you'd like.
- **Drop-Off** You can drop off an offering at the church building. Come to the Northumberland Street door during office hours T-F 8:30-4:30, there is a donation box in the entry. Ring the bell to enter and leave your envelope in the donation box. Tellers are processing dropped off offerings about once every two weeks.
- **E-Transfer** You can e-transfer to the church in the same way you might send other e-transfers. Please clearly note in the message section of the e-transfer how much you are directing to particular funds (For example: Current, Missions, Building, Easter). Funds that are not designated will be directed to Current expenses, which are our day to day expenses for ministries. - Canada Helps Canada Helps is a registered charity that collects online donations for Canadian charities and then passes them on to the charity. Prayer request from the Bustin's – Heavenly Father, the hymn "He Leadeth Me" came to mind yesterday, and music along with Scripture is so important at this time, as we trust you in the midst of the uncertainty of this COVID-19 pandemic.

Today we are praying for our partner in Rwanda, the Association of Rwandan Baptist Churches (AEBR.) Pray for Rwanda, as they are under a strict time of self-isolation. We pray for the many who are unable to work because of the lockdown, and as a result, are unable to buy food. Pray for the government leaders who are providing leadership at this time. They are trying to help reach the most vulnerable, providing them with food aid. We pray that people would be able to understand the need for such restrictions, but also that everyone would have food to eat and a means to prepare it. We thank you that in Rwanda, the number of people who have contracted the virus is low, so far and that no one has died from it. We pray you would continue to watch over the people there, so that travel within the country would be able to take place once again. We pray for our Christian brothers and sisters in Rwanda, that they would be turning to you for strength at this hard time, and that they would be reaching out with your love and kindness to their neighbours at this time.

This also reminds us that on April 7th the people of Rwanda commemorated the 26th anniversary of the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi. Father God we continue to pray for healing in this nation. We pray for peace in people's hearts and for comfort from you as they are still dealing with the aftereffects of this terrible time in their history. It is hard for us to imagine, but bodies continue to be found even today and we pray for the families who are still dealing with the death of their loved ones all these years later.

Pray for the Association of Baptist Churches of Rwanda (AEBR), and the programs that CBM supports, as they are all on hold during this time of lockdown. We pray for Rev. Emmanuel (Ndagijimana) and his leadership team, as they are evaluating how they can provide relief to some of the most vulnerable amongst their congregations. We pray for the members of the churches who may not have internet or ways to worship in a corporate manner right now, that you will help them to worship at home with their families until such time comes that they can gather freely once more.

Father, we pray for our unusual time of Home Assignment, as we are living in Moncton, NB. We are trying to reach out to our individual and church supporters through various methods while still following the government mandates with regard to staying at home. Father, we ask for strength and comfort for Laura Lee and our whole family as we grieve the loss of her dad. At the same time, we also pray for others who may be experiencing a similar situation.

We thank you Heavenly Father, for we know that you are always with us, and that you care for us. We thank you for your plan of salvation that culminated with the resurrection of Jesus. Please continue to be with us in Canada and with those in Rwanda at this time.
