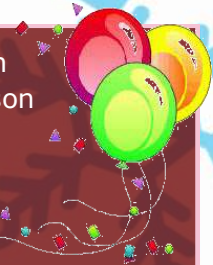

GIVING TO FEED HUNGRY PEOPLE IN FREDERICTON In 2024 Grace's Benevolent Fund donated \$5000 to the Fredericton Greener Village Food Bank and the mission portion (\$1,833) of our Thanksgiving Offering was donated to the Fredericton Community Kitchens. The Canada Post strike in late 2024 greatly impacted the Kitchens as **24%** of their donations arrive by mail. The Benevolent Committee is considering a donation to the Kitchens for 2025, and if you would like to know more about their work, check out the Fredericton Community Kitchens website to see how ways they support our community at frederictoncommunitykitchens.com.

COMMUNITY IMPACT PARTNER PROGRAM: In partnership with JoyFm and a dozen other churches across the city, each month we are highlighting the work of a nonprofit agency seeking to make a difference in Fredericton. These agencies are working with the vulnerable, people dealing with food or housing insecurity and making a positive impact in our community. Along with highlighting the work of each nonprofit, each month will also include a hands-on project in support of that agency.

January's Community Impact Partner is Boaz Global/Ministries which is a charity dedicated to serving teens locally, nationally, and globally. Boaz global ministries partner with communities in impoverished or unstable regions to fight human trafficking and help vulnerable youth find safe environments. Their mission also includes empowering local youth to realize and achieve their potential.



VISION TEAM 2025-2030

In early 2020 Grace formed a Vision Team to create a vision story and goals for the five years of 2020-2025. This is the vision that was adopted at a Congregational Meeting in November of 2020.

From the darkness of his prison cell, John was given a vision of the glory of Jesus' home. He saw an uncountable "multitude from every nation, tribe, people and language," singing as one loud voice "Salvation belongs to our God." (Revelation 7:9-10) Our dream is for Grace Memorial to be transformed by God into a community of grace where people will experience the hope and reality of that eternal Kingdom mosaic in the heart of Fredericton. As a lighthouse is a beacon to save sailors from being lost at sea, Grace can be a beacon in this city, so that no matter where they have come from, who they are, or what they have experienced, people will seek out Grace as a safe place to meet Jesus, develop meaningful relationships with people of faith, and a come into life-giving relationship with God.

Over the past five years, progress has been made towards this dream as we called our first Community Engagement Pastor, have seen an increase in our both our cultural and generational diversity, and more of the congregation involved in Grace groups.

The Leadership Board has recently commissioned a small Vision Team to develop the vision and goals which will give direction to Grace's ministries for the next five years (2025-2030). They begin their work this month with a process of research, assessment of current ministries and consultation with the congregation. It is anticipated the whole process will take about six months and that the team will eventually bring a Five-Year Emphasis document to a congregational meeting for approval in the late spring or early summer.

Along with our pastors, members of the team include Karen Ancheta, Dale Sproull and Cindy DeAdder. Please be in prayer for this team and for our congregation as a whole as we enter this season of discernment.

Weekly Prayer Emphasis for Vision Team:

- **January 5-11:** Pray for the team as they have their first meeting and get to know one another better, and plan out a process of assessment and consultations. Pray that the whole process might be Spirit-led.
 - * **January 12-18:** Pray the team might sense the Spirit's leading as they look where God has led us to this point.
 - * **January 19-25:** Pray the team might have been filled with God's grace as they do their work.
 - * **January 26-31:** Pray the team might sense of Spiritual discernment as they listen and consult within the congregation about our realities and dreams for Grace.

- 2. QUIET & STEADY** This person is there and ready to listen. They might not always want to run around, but they're willing to be there and help out. They bring mature energy and are a vital part of the group, as they often connect to the more shy and quiet children.
- 3. BACKSTAGE CREW** This person may not always want to work with anyone else but wants to be involved. They're great at setup, cleanup, paperwork and anything in between, but they maybe don't want to be in the limelight or can't always be there week to week. They are vital in ensuring things get done in time and that rules are followed!

OUR CHILDREN & YOUTH programs thrive when we have all different age ranges, backgrounds, and marital statuses represented in our leaders. It's important to show the next generation people living for Jesus in all different stages of life; as leaders and volunteers, we teach people about Jesus through our words, and our actions. 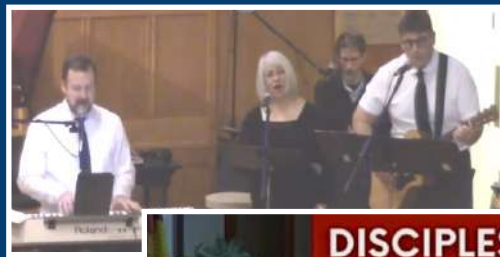

In this 8-week series, we'll search through the book of Colossians to help us form a complete picture of Jesus. With some video teaching from Louie Giglio, each week we will focus on a specific passage from Colossians which will help us form a clearer understanding of our Savior.

OPPORTUNITIES TO GIVE AT GRACE

There are 4 primary funds to which people designate offerings:

Current – The Ministry of Grace. This fund supports everything we do as a congregation.

Missions - Supporting our Ministry Partners: This fund supports our donations to our partners such as Canadian Baptist Ministries (around the world) Canadian Baptists of Atlantic Canada (Atlantic Provinces), Baptist Chaplaincy in the hospitals, Greenhill Lake Camp, Acadia Divinity College, Crandall University, and more.

Building – Major Property Repairs: This fund is used to help with major repairs to the church building such as a roof.

Benevolent – People in Emergency Need: This fund is used to help congregants and community people when they are facing a financial crisis for whatever reason.
