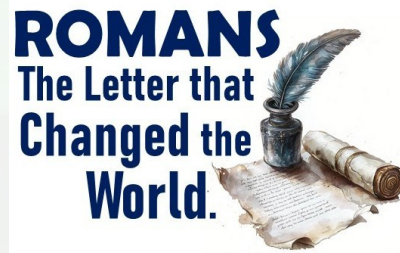




Messages this month


THURSDAY PRAYER LUNCHES

The wording on the front of the invitation card is designed to gain attention and hopefully invite curiosity. It intentionally has a very non-church feel, and the scripture is based on Ecclesiastes 2:1-10 from Solomon. Interestingly, this type of lifestyle has been present throughout time with the same results. Because this event is created for the "unchurched/it's been a long time/I used to go when I was young..etc", the most effective invitation is going to be from you personally. Be excited but don't "preach" the invite, instead try handing them an invitation card and say "My church is hosting an evening of great food, music, and some honest conversation about love and grace. I'd love for you to join me and check it out." Assure them they will not be singled out or pressured, and it's not a sermon. They are our guests invited to an evening of music, dinner, and conversation. A safe space to ask questions or just listen.

NOTES FROM THE ANNUAL MEETING (FEBRUARY 22, 2026)

After the usual opening formalities (reading the rules of order, adopting the agenda and minutes) the various reports were reviewed and adopted. Highlights included:

Leadership – The Vision/Priorities Team completed its work, and a Youth and Family Pastoral Search team was formed in December.

Discipleship – Continues to operate without a Coordinator, but each ministry continues to do its work. With changes to the school hours, Graceland had its final meeting in May. Grace Kids and Grace Youth continue to be led by a dedicated team of volunteers. A small team of youth were able to participate in Tidal Impact, a large youth-led mission event held in PEI.

Fellowship - Continues to operate without a Coordinator with other teams or church staff initiating fellowship events. The Connection Coordinator organized the usher/greeter schedule this year. The Welcome Café continues to be an important moment of fellowship and connection each Sunday, and special thanks go to Gerry Taylor, who helped oversee several fellowship meals throughout the year.

Outreach – Led by Pastor Jim, there were many opportunities to serve others over the year, including Coldest Night of the Year, Second Chance Clothing, Operation Shoe Box, and the SENT Team, which spent a week serving in the Dominican Republic in June. The team is also working with a local family to help sponsor a refugee family currently in Turkey.

Connection – Led by Dale Sproull, this team was active during the year with the Friendly Visitor program, special seniors’ events (including the largest number for cottage day ever) and welcoming six new members in 2025.

Property & Finance – Treasurer T.J Smith presented the financial reports and budget. The operating deficit for 2025 was \$17,035, which reduced the accumulated surplus to just over \$15,000. Throughout the year, along with minor repairs, the roof over the gymnasium was replaced at a cost of \$51,000. Mission giving was up again in 2025 and as part of the five-year priorities, an estate gift was designated towards the expenses to call a full-time Youth and Family Pastor. The total annual Current Account Budget was set at \$385,200.

Two items of new business were discussed.

1. A Sabbatical Policy for full-time pastors was adopted. This will allow a full-time pastor with seven years of service to apply for a two-month sabbatical, or with more than ten years service a three-month sabbatical for spiritual renewal, study or a special project.
2. Concerns were raised about the availability of a pastor when an emergency arises and both pastors happened to be out of town. The concern was referred to the Leadership Board.

Wednesday April 1st

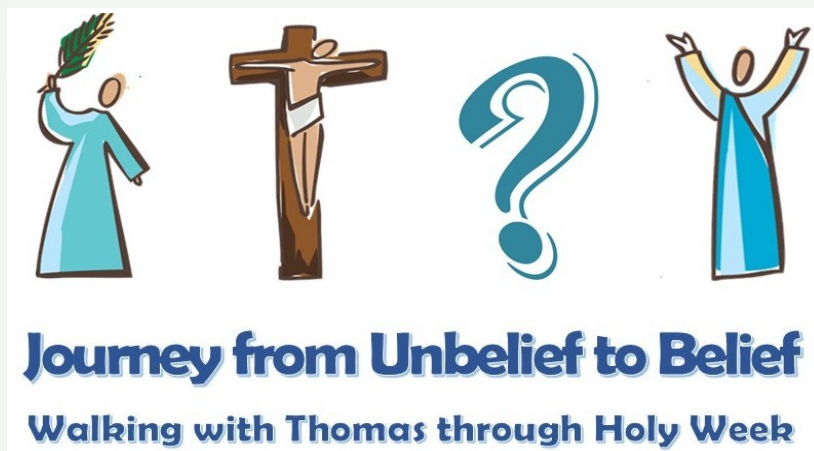

The **Nursery** is located off the Welcome Centre, is currently available during services for families with adult supervision. In the main space, services are Livestreamed so parents can still watch the service. This quiet space provides toys, books, and a rocking chair. A semi-private room is set up for all newborn needs.



GRACE KIDS Children in Kindergarten to Grade 5 will begin in the worship service with the whole community. Midway through the service, children are invited to follow our leaders and volunteers to the Family Centre for an age-appropriate program.



Grace Youth is weekly on Fridays from 7 - 9 PM, this high-energy community of middle and high school students meets from November to Mid-June. We focus on helping students to think more deeply about what God is saying to us in His word and helping them to form their own opinions about Christ. New youth are always welcome.
